- We have robust and flexible plans to ensure we can continue to deliver key services across the justice system.
- A network of priority courts will remain open during the coronavirus pandemic to make sure the justice system continues to operate effectively.
- Pregnant women in custody who do not pose a high risk of harm to the public will be temporarily released from prison within days to protect them and their unborn children from coronavirus.

NEW: The Legal Aid Agency has unveiled a support package for civil, family and criminal legal aid practitioners to ensure access to justice during the coronavirus outbreak. HMPPS

Prisons and probation services have implemented significant changes to comply with the Government's social distancing rules and to protect staff and service users. The service has been working closely with public health experts, as well as criminal justice partners, to ensure that robust contingency plans are in place and immediate action can be taken wherever cases are identified. As of 17:00 on THURSDAY 2 APRIL:

- 88 prisoners have tested positive for COVID-19 across 29 prisons;
- 15 prison staff have tested positive for COVID-19 across 9 prisons;
- 4 Prisoner Escort and Custody Services (PECS) staff have tested positive for COVID-19.
