COVID-19 Stakeholder Update / 15.05.20

The stakeholder update will not be issued at weekends, other than to communicate major announcements.

- We have robust and flexible plans to ensure we can continue to deliver key services across the justice system.
- <u>Independent public health monitoring</u> suggests the steps we have taken are successfully limiting deaths and the transmission of coronavirus in prisons. Those measures include restricted regimes and social distancing within prisons, the early release of low-risk offenders approaching their release date, creating more space with 500 temporary cells and the re-opening of a formerly closed prison at Medway.
- Our priority is to make sure we can keep everyone in courts safe. Some courts are now in a position, with approval from Public Health England and Public Health Wales, to take some first steps towards the <u>resumption of jury trials</u>.

<u>HMPPS</u>

NEW: Family video calls will be introduced at prisons and young offender institutions across England and Wales. Following a successful trial at HMP Berwyn, HMPPS is installing the technology at 10 prisons and young offender institutions (YOIs) across England and Wales, with a wider rollout in the coming weeks, to maintain vital family contact for prisoners and young offenders during the coronavirus pandemic. Prisons and probation services have implemented significant changes to comply with the Government's social distancing rules and to protect staff and service users. The service has been working closely with public health experts, as well as criminal justice partners, to ensure that robust contingency plans are in place and immediate action can be taken wherever cases are identified. As of 17:00 on THURSDAY 14 MAY:

- 405 prisoners have tested positive for COVID-19 across 74 prisons;
- 528 prison staff have tested positive for COVID-19 across 71 prisons;
- 19 Prisoner Escort and Custody Services (PECS) staff have tested positive for COVID-19.

Further updates with the latest figures may be released later this evening to the media and will be included here the following day for information, so please do bear with us if they are superseded during the day.
