I am a qualified Sensory Integration trained Advanced Speech & Language Therapist (SI-SALT), having completed a Masters in Speech & Language Pathology in July 2017. I have since done an additional Postgraduate Diploma in Sensory Integration, enabling me to qualify as an Advanced Sensory Integration Practitioner in April 2023. I also hold an undergraduate BSc degree in Psychology. I work with primary aged children who have significant complex needs in my SI-SALT role. I am a current practising Registered Intermediary, I qualified as an RI in June 2022 and have taken over 170 cases, mainly working with children between the ages of 2 – 11. My specialisms are young people who are typically developing, have developmental language disorders, Autism, ADHD, moderate to severe learning disability etc. I have also recently started to take cases of young people up to the chronological age of 20 who have a cognitive age below 11 years of age. I currently balance my RI role with my SI-SALT role, undertaking RI work in the evenings, on weekends and in the school holidays. I have supported young people both in Crown Court and in Youth Court, I have professional experience at Ground Rules Hearing's, Section 28 proceedings and Pre-Court Visits. I am an IFJ member and have completed many CPD courses with their organisation. These include but are not limited to: RI Skills for court, attendance at the Mental Health SIG, Working with Suspects, Use of symbols in justice settings etc. I can provide a full list of my CPD on request. I was chair of the North West RI group in 2024 over the course of 12 months. I attend an RI cohort support group every 8 weeks which is an informal meet up with those people I trained with in April 2022 to share best practice and ideas. I also continue to attend the North West RI group meetings 3 x per year.

I achieved my 1st class degree in Psychology in 2007 followed by a Masters in Psychological Research Methods (2008) and a PhD in Psychology in 2012. I have worked as a Senior Lecturer in Forensic Psychology since 2011. I teach, supervise, and publish research in the areas of applied developmental psychology, trauma informed practice and the communication of children/young people during police interviews and court settings.

I have experience of working with children aged 2 to 18 in forensic and educational settings. I trained with Triangle and became an intermediary in 2012. During this time, I worked with young defendants in the court system under the age of 25. In 2014 I qualified as a Registered



Intermediary and have been practising in this role since. My areas of expertise are children and young people, pre-school children, autism, ADHD, trauma, and complex trauma.

Based on my academic and practical experiences I am an expert in the criminal justice system, and I am often asked by the courts to act as an expert witness to review intermediary and police practice. The review process draws on best practice guidance, and research informed practice.

I completed supervision training for PhD projects and doctorate students at Teesside University in 2012. I have supervised 7 PhD students and 4 doctoral level students. I have also supervised over 180 undergraduate and masters level dissertation projects since 2012. I have worked as a personal tutor at University for 14 years where students come to me with personal issues, and I offer basic emotional and academic support before referring on to counselling services. My supervision experience is based mainly in personal tutoring and research supervision.

I completed supervision training for PhD projects and doctorate in 2012 through Teesside University's Research and Enterprise Office. I cannot remember the exact title or date. The course lasted for 3 days. This is not accredited.

I am a registered Art Psychological Therapist and Speech and Language Therapist with over 35 years experience working with children and adults with communication difficulties and mental health issues. I worked as a Samaritan which I believe is an excellent training and underpins my practice.

Over the last thirty plus years, I have worked with adults and children with a range of communication disorders, such as: Neurological conditions i.e. stroke, MND, Paediatric disorders- developmental speech and language delay, Specific Learning Difficulties/Disability, Autism and emotionally related conditions. I have worked in special schools, hospitals, NGOs and health clinics.



Having worked in adult mental health on acute wards and in day hospitals and mental health services for children, I am able to work across a wide range of cases as an Intermediary. This involves working with PTSD, Depression, Bi- polar disorder and Schizophrenia.

I am a member of The Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists (RCSLT) and The British Association of Art Psychological therapists (BAAT) and I am registered with HCPC –No SL15848 /AS13736.

Synthesising these professions led me to become a researcher as part of M.Phil research into ‘The Design of Equipment for Communication Disorders’. I then worked as a specialist design consultant while continuing my SLT practice.

I trained with MoJ as a Reg. Intermediary in 2009. Since then, I have worked on over 500 cases as an RI and Court Appointed Intermediary across Criminal, Family and Immigration Jurisdictions. I am a specialist generalist as I have worked in many clinical settings over my professional life, working with 2 yr olds to 95 yr old adults, who are witnesses, defendants, appellants etc across the Justice System.

My cases cover a wide range of communication needs including neurological conditions, ASD, MH and pre-schoolers, adolescents, adults and vulnerable elderly.

As founder member of the charity Intermediaries for Justice www.intermediaries-for-justice.co.uk I have been fortunate in being able to interact in the intermediary community.

I have chaired and contributed to the writing of many Toolkits for The Advocates Gateway and have also contributed to ICCA’s working party on their *20 Principles of questioning Advocacy* and The Vulnerable- A guide to cross examination of vulnerable people.

In 2019 I was invited to join the Human Rights Bar Association to run workshops at Delhi Law School for Human Rights Lawyers and Law Pupils. I had the pleasure to present at the Fair Trials conference in Milan in 2025.

Although I had worked with defendants and in the family courts for many years, under the new framework, I became an HMCTS Court Appointed Intermediary Services (HAIS)- Approved Service Provider in 2022.

In 2011, I participated in my supervisors clinical training run by Marie Curie Care. The training was both practical and theoretical. Although this was geared towards palliative care staff, the various models of supervision were studied, such as the work of Gibbs, Heron, Padesky, Proctor & Driscoll. Following the training, I have supervised individual and small groups for nurses, therapists, and clinicians. I have run regular talking or art therapy supervision groups for speech and language therapist and art psychotherapists.



I train the police on a regular basis about 'The Role of the Intermediary' and 'Trauma Informed Practice.' I have also run trainings in India, Ireland and Bulgaria.

I have a varied, extensive and successful career in social work, specialising in adult mental health, forensic mental health, and safeguarding adults teams. I have a BA in French, German, and Psychology (1995), and a Masters in Social Work and Approved Legal Interventions (2002). I have 25 years' experience in adult mental health social work in London. I am also an Approved Mental Health Professional (AMHP). I have trained new police recruits in working effectively with AMHPs during community Mental Health Act assessments.

I have provided professional, high quality, reflective one to one supervision for over 15 years. I trained as a Registered Intermediary in 2021 and since that time, I have worked with over 100 witnesses at VRIs, and at court in Livelink and Section 28 hearings. I work with adults aged 18 and over with any mental health issue, including dementia, schizophrenia, psychosis, bi-polar, personality disorders, anxiety and PTSD. I also work with witnesses who have autism, Aspergers, and mild or mild to moderate learning disabilities. Staff development, best practice and helping others to develop skills and confidence is an area of my work I really enjoy.

I work as a Practice Educator and Visiting Lecturer for the University of Kent and Birmingham City University, supervising students on social work degree and apprenticeship placements. As an offsite Practice Educator and Supervisor, my focus is to assist students to consolidate knowledge in law, procedure, and good practice, and to develop their professional confidence and ability to reflect and critically analyse their own practice, as well as other interpersonal dynamics. I utilise a reflective, partnership style of supervision, encouraging them to reflect and critically analyse decision and actions they take, and the impact this has on them both professionally and personally. I adopt a psychodynamic approach, encouraging them to think about unconscious processes and biases which may be at play. I am skilled in implementing adult learning and supervision models to work through and resolve work-related dilemmas and conflict. I am holistic, empathic in my approach to supervision and have built excellent relationships with all the staff I have supervised.

I recently completed the Bond Solon Expert Witness Certificate in Civil and Criminal Law. I now work as an Expert Witness, compiling detailed court reports for civil and criminal cases where social work expertise is required. I have completed several immigration reports for tribunals, and reports for coroner's courts. I also work as a Freelance Trainer, devising and delivering training to local authorities, NHS and charity organisations on Safeguarding Adults, Mental Health, Improving Staff Performance through Coaching and Mentoring, Mental Health Law, Mental Capacity Act, Domestic Violence, and Coercive Control. I was also a panel member of a London Multi Agency Public Protection Arrangements (MAPPA) panel for several years, providing expert guidance on all aspects of forensic case law, mental health diagnoses, risk management and best practice to the police, probation, housing, and inpatient professionals. The purpose of MAPPA is to help to reduce the risk of re-offending behaviour of people who have committed sexual and violent offences. Its aim is also to protect the public, including previous victims, from serious harm. It is vital that relevant agencies work together effectively as part of this process. I have worked as an Approved Mental Health Professional (AMHP) since 2009. AMHPs are mental health professionals who have been approved by a local social services authority to perform certain duties under the Mental Health Act. This role involves a high-level of specialist knowledge about mental health law, legislation, mental health symptoms and prognosis. It involves coordinating the mental health act assessment and admission to hospital under Section. I feel that my experience and knowledge in these areas equips me to help other RI's to work effectively with the witnesses, the police and the CPS.

I am a Care Quality Commission (CQC) Inspector for Mental Health and Adult Social Care, and a panel member of the National Quality Assurance Panel for Newly Qualified Social Worker's Assessed Year of Employment (ASYE), providing quality inspection, assurance and best practice for mental health community, forensic and inpatient services. I have provided clinically supervision to SLTs, SaLTAs and student SLTs during my 19 years working within in the NHS.

I offer reflective practice supervision to intermediaries. My approach is to listen attentively and provide a supportive space for us to explore your intermediary experiences.
